The student will interpret laboratory and diagnostic studies and incorporate appropriate data from medical records, consultants, and family members. The student will demonstrate the ability to perform relevant procedural skills including: gown and scrub for surgery, suture tissue, tie surgical knots, participate in vaginal delivery.

Method of Evaluation: Chart review; Observation by team members

#3 Medical Knowledge

Educational Objectives: The student will demonstrate knowledge of management of clinical presentations in obstetrics and gynecology and additional aspects unique to women's health. The student will analyze patient data, relate it to basic scientific and clinical fund of knowledge, generate a ranked differential diagnosis, and propose cogent diagnostic and therapeutic approaches.

Method of Evaluation: Observation by team members

#4 Practice-Based Learning

Educational Objectives: The student will actively seek feedback on performance and perform self-reflection. The student will apply an evidence-based approach to patient care.

Method of Evaluation: Observation by team members

#5 Interpersonal and Communication Skills

Educational Objectives: The student will orally present a patient's history, physical exam, relevant diagnostic studies, assessment and plan in a well-organized, concise fashion. The student will Establish effective rapport with patients and family.
